**Nexicom Telecommunications Inc.**

**Re: Fulfillment of Competitive Local Exchange Obligations**

Nexicom Telecommunications Inc. (NEXICOM) is pleased to inform the Commission that it has met the Commission's Competitive Local Exchange Carrier (CLEC) obligations as set out in CRTC Telecom Decision 97-8, Local Competition. As a result, NEXICOM is prepared to begin offering service in January of 2007 within the 705 NPA, more specifically, the Peterborough, Lakefield and Bridgenorth exchanges.

NEXICOM has completed the following CLEC obligations:

- Obtained a central office code (NXX) for each operating exchange and has interconnected in the designated Local Interconnection Region in the 705 NPA.
- Completed all interconnection agreements between it and the carriers with which it exchanges traffic. A copy of these agreements has been filed with the CRTC for its approval including the MALI, BLIF, 911 & Schedule C
- Filed with the Commission and received interim approval as of November 2, 2006 (CRTC 2006-297) for its interconnection tariffs for Local Exchange Carriers (LECs), Interexchange Carriers (IXs), and Wireless Service Providers (WSPs).
- Implemented Local Number Portability (LNP).
- Provide Message Relay Service (MRS).
- Will treat CLEC generated calls between ILECs' exchanges where the ILEC's toll charges apply as toll calls for contribution payment purposes (if applicable to NEXICOM).
- Provide 9-1-1 service to its local customers using Bell Canada's Emergency Services (911) Tariff.
- Included in its interconnection tariff the terms and conditions under which it will provide subscriber listings to other LECs (BLIF).

- Ensure that its end-users have direct access, under reasonable terms and conditions, to services provided by any other LEC serving in the exchange.
- Made terms of service known to potential customers. A copy has been filed with the CRTC.
- \* [ • Made serving area maps available upon request at its business office. Copies have been filed with the CRTC.
- Will file a copy of its PIC/CARE Handbook with the Commission for its approval coincident with the first request NEXICOM receives for equal access. NEXICOM will use the most recent CISC PIC/CARE Handbook available at the time.
- Exchanged the minimum set of CCS7 message types and has configured its network to ensure that customer privacy is protected by enabling the following features:
  - 1) Delivery of the privacy indicator when invoked by an end-user.
  - 2) Provision of automated universal per call blocking of calling line identification.
  - 3) Provision of per line call display blocking to qualified end customers.
  - 4) Disallowance of Call Return to a blocked number; and
  - 5) Provision of universal Call Trace.
  
- Have procedures in place to enforce the Commission's restrictions on Automatic Dialing-Announcing Devices, Automatic Dialing Devices and unsolicited facsimiles applicable in Bell Canada's territory.
- Contacted the Canadian Numbering Consortium.
- Joined the Canadian LNP Consortium.
- Participated in the Canadian Portable Contribution Consortium.
- Provided the Commission with compliance of all ownership and control regulations.

Copies of this letter will be sent to the Central Fund Administrator, Canadian Numbering Consortium, Canadian LNP Consortium, Canadian Portable Contribution Consortium and all LECs and CLECs operating in NEXICOM's serving area.
